From the Pastor

Lenten Soup & Study: More Hymns!

Ladies and gentlemen, for my last act I will lead another series of hymn studies at this year's Soup & Study sessions. Ash Wednesday is February 26, and, as is our custom, we'll have two services on that day, at 12:00 noon and 7:30 pm. Both will feature an order for public confession, the imposition of ashes, and the sacrament of Holy Communion. Our Soup & Study series will begin the following Wednesday, March 4. We gather in the kitchen for our simple meal of soup, bread, and dessert (well, maybe it's not all that simple!) at 6:00 pm, and we regroup in the parlor at 7:00 for our study.

We had such a good time last year singing and studying favorite hymns that we decided that a second year of hymns would be in order. This year the emphasis will be on seasonal hymns, rather than the general hymns that predominated last year's study.

During week one, we'll look at Advent hymns. As you know, some of my favorite hymns are those that anticipate the coming of Christmas, as well as the coming again of Christ in power and glory. Since I'll be away that week, Robin Koegel will lead you through these hymns.

Weeks two and three will feature Christmas carols and hymns of the Epiphany season. We'll study the hymns of Lent and Holy Week during week four, and we'll conclude our study in week five with a survey of Easter and Pentecost hymns. Since we don't sing or say "Alleluia" during Lent, we'll have to find some novel way of vocalizing the "A Word" when we sing the songs of Easter ten days before the festival of the resurrection.

I hope you'll join us for this year's Soup & Study series. Even if you can't be there for the meal, please consider coming to the study. These gatherings are a lot of fun, and they're also informative and edifying. Plus, it may be the last chance you have to sit in on classes that I teach.




Angels Circle

As we well know, there are many issues facing seniors. Some are medical, some financial, and one issue that tends to get over-looked is spiritual. It has been documented in studies that seniors tend to pray more and read the Bible more as they age. In one study it was found that 75% of older Americans pray at least once a day. Bible reading has declined in many age groups but half of the Americans over 65 read the Bible at least twice a week compared to 27% of the people between the ages of 18 and 29. Seniors teach us that our faith life is always capable of

growth, from birth to old age. Seniors attend church more regularly than any other age group. Our faith helps us mature in God's wisdom and experience His love.

Unfortunately there are times when elderly people encounter obstacles to spiritual support systems. Some are unable to get to church and participate in worship and other activities. Without realizing it, some congregations put their efforts and energy on young families with children... leaving seniors to feel left outside of the community. Some have hearing issues making it difficult to hear sermons and to have conversations with other parishioners. It is sometimes difficult for seniors with dementia to participate in worship as they experience anxiety in groups. Church attendance, prayer, and reading the Bible is known to have a positive impact on health.

We lift up with gratitude the many seniors in our congregation. Many of these people are responsible for the gifts that we enjoy as a congregation today as they spent their younger years raising children in the church and helping to

build this congregation through teaching Sunday school, serving on church council, participating in WELCA, among other ministries in the church.

The Senior Ministry Team exists to serve our seniors. If there is an unmet need, perhaps someone needing a ride or some other type of care, please let a member of the team know. 
