Storyteller Lisa Boom tells the story of a king who invited artists to submit their perfect painting of "peace."

Two entries are in the final running, one a calm mountain lake; and the other, a rugged mountain peak with a single waterfall running between the jagged edges.

When the king chose the painting of the mountains and waterfall, he pointed not to the waterfall but to a tiny bush growing behind the waterfall with a tiny bird's nest containing a mother bird sitting patiently on her eggs.

"Because," he explained, "peace is not only in a place where there is no noise, trouble, or hard work. Peace is in the midst of things as they are, when there is calm in your heart. That is the real meaning of peace."

From Re-Opening/Gathering Committee:

It has been three weeks since St. Timothy opened its doors for regathering at the Church, and overall, we feel the worship services (both in-person and online) have been going well. We want to thank everyone for their support of all the regulations that

have been put in place to help ensure a healthy and safe gathering for all attending. As of now, we will not be making any changes to the current guidelines. Just a few reminders:

- If you are planning on attending in-person, please register online prior to the service so we can ensure room is available in the church. We are still at 25% capacity.
- -For those unable to attend in-person, live streaming of the Sunday service is still available on Facebook Live.
- -For those attending in-person, reminder that before and after the service, please continue social distancing best practices and avoid congregating in the narthex or parking lot.

The reopening committee has been working hard to ensure all practices are met to keep everyone safe. Should you have any questions or suggestions regarding the current guidelines in place, please feel free to reach out to a committee member.

From Christian Ed:

Sunday School has begun in a very different way than ever before. We are offering both in person and remote learning, with remote learners using Google Classroom. This is all new to us, so we ask parents to please be patient with us in this new learning experience. We are still working out the "bugs" in this very different way of learning. The Gathering Committee and the Christian Education Committee want you to feel confident about the social distancing and disinfection of St. Timothy.

- Reminder: Congregational Meeting is Sunday, 9/27/20 following the 10AM service. Will be a brief meeting to approve the annual report and vote in council & endowment members. CDC guidelines for mask wearing, social distancing, & capacity will be adhered to - make sure to register for the Sun. service!
- We are in search of 2 volunteers for the Endowment Committee for 3 year terms. Just 1-2 meetings per year and you get to give away money! Please contact Laurie Crowley before Sunday's meeting if interested.
- Regular office hours have resumed Monday Friday 9AM 12PM.
- Pastor Weishaupt will in the office on Mondays and can also be reached via the church phone/voicemail system for emergencies and/or return calls.
- Rainbow Nursery will resume classes in October. They are regulated to the downstairs completely and the church will not be using the areas at all. Please use restroom facilities on the Sanctuary level or Fellowship Hall only.

We began accepting donations of seasonal clothing in September, on Monday mornings between 9 am and 12 noon while our volunteers are sorting in Fellowship Hall. This will continue for the foreseeable future, and we are thankful for the

We delivered clothing and toiletries to some of our sites, and others picked clothing up at the church, as they are all determining how to safely distribute these items to the homeless and families they serve. All the sites report that they are serving more people now than before the COVID pandemic began, and in total are now serving well over 3000 individuals and families each month.

We are modifying our annual Blessing Bag Program for this year. Rather than collect items and assemble the Blessing Bags, we are asking for monetary donations which we will use to purchase Blessing Bag items in bulk and deliver them directly to our sites. Our Flyer below has more details.

We are extremely grateful for the support of the St. Timothy council and congregation in allowing us to resume limited operations, and we look forward to providing as much assistance as we can in the coming months to those in need.




