AUTUMN PRAYERS

ovember 3, Election day, is soon upon us, and emotions, anxiety and stress seem to be very high, in addition we are all dealing with a pandemic.

The endless barrage of negative news seems to add to fuel to the stress and burn out that many of us feel. Yes, Election is upon us and we're dealing with a pandemic but Thanksgiving is just a few weeks away too.

With all that is happening around you, your church is a place of refuge, a place of peace and celebration — a place of giving thanks. A great feeling of thankfulness washed over one particular day. Moments before the service started, I noticed the beauty, the calm and peacefulness of the sanctuary while listening to the wind gently kneading St. Timothy's immense rafters.

Let's transport for a moment back to another era...

Imagine that you are living in the Ancient Near East and the time for one of the big annual festivals has come. It's the **Feast of Sukkot**, a Jewish holiday of giving thanks for the autumn harvest and for commemorating the 40 years Israel spent wandering the desert after leaving slavery in Egypt.

PSALM 100

A psalm for giving grateful praise

Shout for joy to the LORD, everyone on earth.
Worship the LORD with gladness.

Come to him with songs of joy.

Know that the LORD is God. He made us, and we belong to him.

We are his people.
We are the sheep belonging to his flock.

Give thanks as you enter the gates of his temple.

Give praise as you enter its courtyards.

Give thanks to him and

praise his name.

The LORD is good. His faithful love continues forever.
It will last for all time to come.



You make the pilgrimage to the harvest festival from where you live to the holy city both as a tradition and as a sign of obedience to the Biblical Law of the Torah. Your ultimate destination is the holy temple in Jerusalem many days journey.

Your goal is worship, and your motivation is thankfulness and celebration. You want to give thanks for God and all the many good things in life you have experienced for yourself, your family and your people as a whole.

You leave home focused, determined, and expectant, but something gradually changes with each step you take. The journey is long and arduous and the weather is uncooperative, the path is unyielding, the luggage you are bringing with you is gets heavier with every mile, and the caravan that you are traveling with is very noisy.

You left home determined... but now you are annoyed, discouraged, and keep asking yourself, "Why on earth did I leave home to go through all this?" You find it hard to answer that question while you are taking this journey because you lost sight of the reason for your journey. You would rather head home but you have traveled this far, so you decide to keep going. Out habit or just plain stubbornness you press on. Eventually after many days you draw near to your destination. You realize you've entered the **Kidron Valley** which is 4000 feet below as you look up toward the great city of Jerusalem high atop a plateau.

I think we've all been there at some point in our lives. Maybe we are at that very point today! We are at the lowest point in our journey emotionally and physically and we look up toward Jerusalem and want to give up with a mountain before us to climb.



You are at the very same crossing where Jesus took his disciples after the Last Supper before entering the Garden of Gethsemane. That's the garden where Jesus prayed "Father, if you are willing, please take this cup of suffering away from me."

As you look up you can see the great city. The experience leaves you stunned by the spectacle of it. You feel unbalanced looking up toward the sky with the sun in your eyes. You become disoriented as you squint to see all the walls, gates, and levels of civilization there.


But your spirit begins to lift, as you hear a sound, a joyful, beautiful, harmonious chatter coming from deep within the city. Finally, you reach the gates of the city, you see the source of this joyful sound. There are greeters there waiting for you. They greet you with joy, and lift you with a song. The words of the song fill you, and frustrations melt away. You remember the reason you started out on the journey-worship and giving thanks. You leave behind the demanding journey. You leave your doubts and frustrations behind on the trail...you even know the song lyrics. You have arrived!



This was the experience of many pilgrims who traveled to Jerusalem for that special season of giving thanks and celebrating in worship. They would make their way losing sight of why they were going until they would hear the greeters lifting a call to worship. That particular call to worship is what we know as Psalm 100, one of the most beloved psalms. The heading above the first verse tells us that Psalm 100 is a psalm for giving thanks. It is the only psalm of the 150 psalms, so labeled.

Whatever your plans for Thanksgiving this month, give thanks the entire month and pause to read this Psalm of giving thanks aloud, especially during prayer and at the Thanksgiving dinner table giving thanks to God for all that we have. **HAPPY THANKSGIVING!**





How Your Endowment Gift Helps



Dear All,

The St Timothy Endowment Committee is asking you, the congregation, for suggestions for the 2020 endowment benevolent allocation.

Background: St. Timothy Lutheran Church's ministry extends beyond the walls of the sanctuary and into the local and world community. St. Timothy established the Endowment Fund in 2013 through the generosity of Ms. Marie Forester, as St. Timothy was named as beneficiary of her estate.

Purpose: To strengthen and extend God's mission, reaching out in response to human need, locally, nationally, and globally.

Allocation: The Committee is responsible for the annual allocation of endowment dividend funds (\$36,138.00) which is 50% of the 2018 & 2019 total dividends. Of the 50%, 25% (\$18,069) of the total dividends will be determined by the committee and the other 25% (\$18,069) is to be determined by the congregation.

Requirements: Funds can only be given to legally qualified recipients; no funds can be used for St. Timothy's normal operating expenses. Requests can be made for special projects of the congregation, capital improvements for the congregation and other purposes.

For our donations to have the greatest impact please consider giving to the local chapters of national and global organizations.

Due Date: **Nov. 30th.** There is a suggestion box in the back of the Narthex. You will be asked to list one local, one national and one global charity and also include your name on the ballots provided. You may cast your ballot by placing it in the box in the Narthex, mailing it to the church "Attn. Endowment Committee", or emailing it to st.tims395@yahoo.com.

During this transitional time at St. Timothy, this is a great way to bring the St. Timothy family together in giving and the committee looks forward to hearing your suggestions.


