

Ritual purification was an important part of healing. Taking time to heal is crucial in this world of illness and sorrow.

That said, Jesus doesn't want ministry to be hard all the time. Jesus wants us to have joy as a community gathering in his name. We aren't sitting around waiting for him to change the water into wine, we are actively doing important things, but I also know that the day is coming

when he will surprise us with the most delicious wine we have ever tasted. One of these days, hopefully sooner than later, we will gather to feast together. I can hardly wait!

In preparation for that time, I am going to give you all a little bit of homework. It may seem like I'm asking you do something that is just too much in our busy world, but I promise you, that it will bless you as much as it will help our community. I want each person that reads this article to open up the directory and call one family that you know, but haven't talked to in a while. A church is not a wheel with the pastor as the hub connecting to everyone in their own separate spaces. A church is a web of interdependent people – of all ages – loving one another.

I love you. Jesus loves you. And when our water turns into wine...when the party really gets started...I want you to know just how much you love one another.
