For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 1 Corinthians 12: 12

Over the past couple of years that I have had the tremendous honor to serve as pastor of St. Timothy, I have heard from a lot of people about how welcoming our congregation is. Visitors have commented on it when choosing to become members. New visitors have talked about how great the community is and keep coming back. They are praying and considering making this their church home. We can be really proud of this, because not all churches are as friendly and welcoming.

The challenge that confronts us, though, is taking the next step that comes after *welcoming*. That is *belonging*. Belonging means being a part of this congregation. Belonging goes beyond showing up on Sunday mornings for worship to investing in the church with both time and money. It means giving one's opinions – even without being sure that others agree. Essentially, it means having a stake in the ministry of the congregation. This is something we can work on.

Many of you already know this. It has been a prominent subject in conversations that the Strategic Planning group has had with many individuals and groups over the past 6 months. Every single ministry and committee at this church has spoken about the need to have more people power to get their work accomplished. We have also heard from people about their desire to be more involved, but they cannot contribute as they would like due to time conflicts and/or capacity.

The Strategic Planning group saw this as an opportunity to set some goals toward updating how ministry is done in our church. We have started out modestly with goals that should only take about one year to accomplish. You will have the opportunity to vote on these goals at the annual meeting on June 25. The full list is found in this edition of the TIPS. It also will be included in the annual report provided by the committee for you to review in advance. We encourage you to take the time to read over it and ask questions of the committee members before the day of the meeting.

The one goal that may stand out as a very new idea for some is "engage in the RIC process." RIC is an acronym for Reconciling In Christ. This is a program designed by an ELCA organization called Reconciling Works. It is a program to learn and grow in understanding of people that are different from us – to reconcile with

people that may **not** have been welcomed in churches in the past. This will be an opportunity for us to learn about BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and People of Color) and members of the LGBTQIA (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, and Asexual) communities.

Often those of us that are surrounded by people similar to ourselves may not know what feels welcoming or unwelcoming to people that are different. Everyone I have met here at St. Timothy has told me that they work hard to be welcoming. No one is intentionally rejecting anyone, but there are words and actions that can be hurtful to someone unsure of their place here. This program provides an opportunity for all of us to learn how to do better *without shame*. We can learn how to do better ensuring everyone knows that they are beyond welcome to attend worship – that this is, in fact, a place that they can belong.

I encourage you to look over the Reconciling Works website (<u>https://www.reconcilingworks.org/</u>) and bring questions to me. I want us all to be sensitive in our conversations with the broader community, because we are already blessed with members of the above communities and those who love members of these communities. Honest questions are always welcome, but hateful commentary is never constructive. Growth is not always a comfortable process, but it is often well worth the effort. I am so very grateful to be working in mission with you all.




Quilt kits will still be available to anyone who wishes to continue working from home.

# Heart 'n Hands Mission

In June, we are asking for donations of travel and full-size sunscreen, an often-requested item by those we serve. Thank you for your support of our 2023 monthly item collections.



This month we are introducing you to St. Paul's Community Development Corporation, the outreach mission of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Paterson. Begun as a church food pantry in 1970, they opened their Emergency Men's Shelter in 1984 and incorporated in 1990. Today they are a separate, secular, not-for-profit organization guided by a diverse and voluntary board of directors that bridges racial, economic, geographic, and religious boundaries. Their mission is to alleviate the conditions of hunger, homelessness, unemployment,

poverty, and illiteracy in the City of Paterson. They do this by providing emergency services to all in need and by designing long-term approaches to achieving social and economic improvement at the grassroots level.

For many years, Heart 'n Hands Mission set up monthly clothing distribution in the church hall, until the 2020 pandemic ended that program. Since then, we have regularly provided the men's shelter with underwear, socks, jeans, blankets, and a wide variety of personal care items. The shelter houses 35 to 40 men per night, and residents take part in daily programs addressing their needs and assistance finding work with the help of a professional counseling staff.

It is the ultimate goal of the SPCDC Emergency Men's Shelter to work *with* clients to identify the root causes of their homeless condition. Through collaboration, they give their residents a sense of control over their own futures and consequently make them more likely to take responsibility for their own goals.

We greatly appreciate our long relationship with St. Paul's Community Development Center, and thank all of you for your support in this work.

Lord, we ask that you watch over those in need, that they may find shelter when they seek it, food when they are hungry, clothing and comfort when they are cold, and Your grace and loving encouragement in their darkness.

Would you like to be part of a prayer chain? If you are interested, please contact me at the number listed below.

Here's how it works: When someone calls me with a request you will be contacted to pray for that person, you will then pass the request on to one other person who will do the same. These requests will not be published.



To ask for prayer, call me and I will start the prayer chain.  $\downarrow$ Requests can be as simple as "please pray for my neighbor who

has to move into a nursing home?" or it can be "please pray for my daughter Ann". Feel free to give as many or as little details as you feel comfortable. Your request will be on the list for 4 weeks unless you call to continue.

Those calling with requests will be asked if it is confidential or if it can be shared. If you get my answering machine, you can simply say something like 'this is for prayers' and leave a phone number and I will call you when I get home.

We can no longer accept the following items: clothing, including hats and gloves; stationery, calendars, greeting cards; craft supplies; toys; or individually wrapped packets of syrup, jelly, other condiments, or plastic utensils. Additionally please note that medical supplies of any kind cannot legally be distributed by the pantry and therefore cannot be accepted.

Please also consider donating sugar-free, gluten-free, and no-salt food items for our families with members who have dietary restrictions.

We are always in need of paper bags. Please consider donating those you have that are in usable condition to WIN. Thank you!!


